During the month of November you can gain a plenary indulgence for the a soul in purgatory by visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead. You pray an Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory be and the prayer, May the souls of the faithful departed by the mercy of God rest in peace. It is customary too to go to confession and receive holy communion.

From the desk of Father Baier...

I hope that you are well and at peace.

As you noticed, I'm away on vacation this weekend for a few days. I'll be back this Tuesday for our Pastoral Council meeting.

If you look closely on the top of the tabernacle there is a small reliquary that has the relic of St. Pius X who was a pope with a sense of humor, a great faith, and a loving concern especially for children.

Ann Ball relates the following story about St. Pius, "A woman came to the Vatican to have an audience with Pope Pius X; she brought her little son with her. As the mother spoke with the Holy Father, the little boy approached the Pontiff and put his hands on his knees, peering up into his face. Looking kindly at the child, Pius asked the mother his age. "He is four," she answered, "and in two or three years I hope he will receive his First Communion." The Pope looked earnestly at the little boy and him, "Whom do you receive in Holy Communion?"

He answered promptly, "Jesus Christ."

"And who is Jesus Christ?"

"Jesus Christ is God."

The Pope turned to the mother and said, "Bring him to me tomorrow and I will give him Holy Communion myself."

Pope Pius X name was Guiseppe Sarto, and he grew up in a very poor family that was barely able to send him to seminary for studies. He was committed to the poverty that he grew up in and during his priesthood and his episcopacy he also had very little that he needed. Pope Pius X lowered the age of receiving holy communion to the age of reason, 7. He also encouraged people to receive holy communion more frequently, even daily. He fought against the ideas of modernism and died at the outbreak of World War 1.
