From the desk of Father Baier...

Brothers and Sisters,

On my heart this weekend in Gary, the owner of the St. Paul Market who has been missing for a couple of days now and for his family. Please join me in praying for both Gary and his family that God will be with them in this difficult time as they search for his whereabouts.

Today's scripture discusses leprosy. People with leprosy were outcasts of society and considered unclean. Who are the societal outcasts of my community? What might I do to show genuine concern for them: The societal outcasts can be those who are on the margins, those with anger, those with mental illness, those who are socially awkward, the unemployed, the homeless, those with addictions, those with special needs, those in the LGBTQ+ community, those who don't meet our definition of normal. God brings healing to leprosy, he brings healing to those on the margins. If Jesus cares for those on the margins, so should we. Caring does not mean accepting addiction, accepting sin, accepting violence as okay, but it does mean having a loving concern for those on the margins and seeking to bring them God's healing.

Where do I need to say to Jesus in my own life, "You can make me clean."?

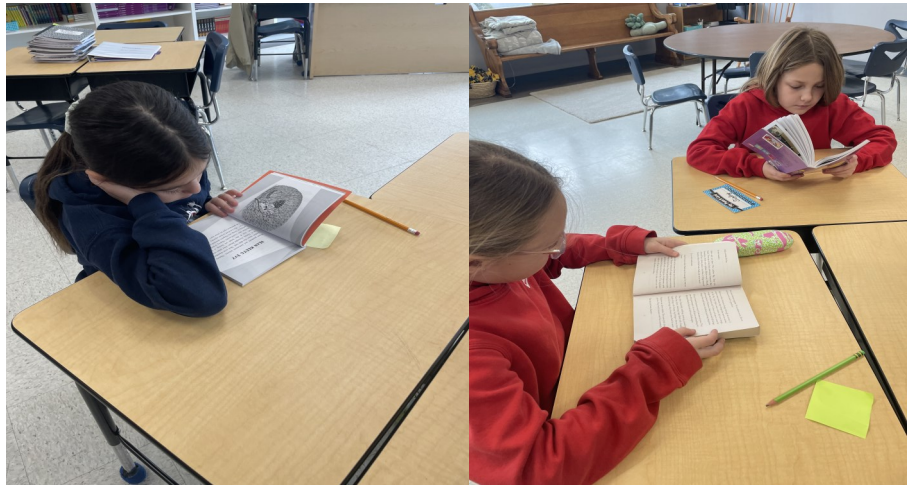
SPPS Spotlight

The 3rd-8th graders are working hard in Language Arts this year! We have been working on novel units, writing units, and doing independent book reports across the grades.

Specifically, the 8th grade class read and studied a novel unit on the book, *Long Walk to Water*, by Linda Sue Park. This book is a true story about the water crisis and civil war in South Sudan. Students are using their faith and community outreach skills to brainstorm ideas on how to raise money for the “Water for South Sudan” nonprofit organization now that they have read the book. This organization provides clean water to communities in Africa.

3rd through 5th grade students are working on their public speaking and presenting skills, among other skills, by creating book reports. They are reading books that interest them, and presenting these books in a book report such as setting maps, collages, letters, and other formats. They then present their project to the class! They then take comprehension tests on their books to receive class prizes.
