## Updates from Father Baier in the Holy Land...

We've been here in the holy land for a total of two days, but it feels like we've been here a week with all that we have seen and done. Yesterday we went on a boat ride on the sea of Galilee that was very inspirational, today we did a blessing of marriages, there are five couples on the trip, at Cana in Galilee. We went up to the top of Mount Tabor where Jesus was transfigured, and we also spent time at the church of the annunciation where we celebrated mass. Israel in many ways

as a very different country than the United States I've been asking the pilgrims, what is the grace that you have experienced so far. It's actually a more difficult question than you might imagine. Many of them responded by just simply liking I liked Magdala or I loved going out on the sea of Galilee. I pushed them further though giving an example of my own grace that I really felt the Lord was giving me patience and peace here as we navigated the crowds and found as well the presence of Christ here.

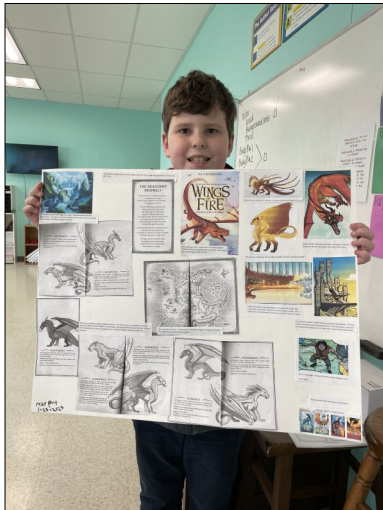


In Saint Paul we

So far we've been in Galilee, but will be headed towards Bethlehem tomorrow. I ask you to consider, what is the grace you have experienced this week?

## SPPS Classroom Spotlight—Language Arts

The 3rd-8th graders have been working hard in Language Arts! This year, we have been focusing on a comprehensive curriculum for Language Arts, which includes emphasis in spelling, grammar, writing, cursive, reading, literacy groups, and root word work. Every day, students participate in leveled literacy groups where they read chapters and find connections to their own life, look up vocabulary



words, and summarize what they have read. The students also make many connections to their faith in God through what they are reading, and we discuss this in class as well!
