I am looking forward to getting back to work and sharing the grace is that I have received from the Lord in my time here. Mike Coleman and I had the blessed experience of spending the night in prayer in the church of the holy sepulcher. In the early morning hours I asked one of the monks if I would be able to concelebrate mass, he said you can celebrate in the tomb. I didn't realize until he was handing me the chalice and telling me you have 25 minutes that he was saying I would be the main celebrant in the tomb of our Lord. I had to celebrate in Spanish for seven Italians, they did their best to understand and I tried my best to celebrate mass quickly and devoutly. I cannot describe what an experience that was being in the empty tomb where the Lord rose. He is risen, alleluia alleluia!



## SPPS Classroom Spotlight—Spanish

Hola! Welcome to Spanish Class at SPPS! We have been very busy so far this year. We started the year learning some basic words (colors, numbers) and phrases (Hola, Como estas, mucho gusto). We have now transitioned into putting all that hard work into forming sentences. We meet once a week and spend our time in our workbooks and most importantly using our new language to speak to one another! For our older students, we have recently added an interactive online Spanish program called Duolingo. This is a wonderful additional tool that compliments our classroom activities. Along with learning Spanish as a second language we are also focusing on learning about Hispanic culture. Most recently we learned about the celebration of Christmas called Las Posadas. This celebration begins on December 16th and lasts for nine days ending on December 24th. Las Posadas recalls the journey Joseph and Mary made to Bethlehem.
