SPPS Classroom Spotlight

Oh no, the troll has destroyed the bridge and the three billy goats can't cross the river! What will we do?

A STEM challenge of course! The 1st/2nd grade class at SPPS love STEM!
 (STEM = Science, Technology, Engineering & Math)

Our most recent challenge was to design a raft that could carry 3 toy goats across the water using only wind power. Students worked in teams of 3 to plan, create, and build a raft using only 5 of the provided materials. Since only wind power was used students had to attach a sail to their raft. Each team decided on the best materials to use, made a list, collected materials and built the raft.



On the write-up students included measurements for the raft and sail, an illustration, and a description of what happened when the raft was tested. The first raft had a tall sail and tipped over when it was put in the water. One raft made it across the water with the 3 goats and then sank when water leaked in through the cracks. Many of the rafts took the goats across the water safely! The class was very happy to have Mrs. Davidson and Father Baier stop by during the raft tests to share in our excitement and enthusiasm for learning!
