From the desk of Father Baier...

I hope you are well and good. Tuesday is our penance service. The second commandment is that we should not take the name of the Lord in vain. Clear examples of doing this are words of anger against the Lord. Blasphemy is using the name of the Lord in an offensive way. A common example among many young people is using the expression, "Oh my God," not in any way prayerful, but simply to express astonishment and surprise. Such an expression is inappropriate and does not do honor to the name of God. I suggest if you hear one of these expressions or if you yourself have the vice of saying them, follow up the expression with a quiet "Lord have mercy". This is in effect a prayer asking for forgiveness. This commandment is about keeping the name of the Lord holy. As we say in the Lord's prayer, "hallowed be thy name". Our job is to keep holy the name of the Lord in our thoughts and in our words whether spoken or in writing. The Israelites so revered the name of God as revealed at the burning bush to Moses YHWH, that is remained unspoken and is unspoken by orthodox Jews today. We could learn from this practice. Although you may not fall into any of these ways of using the Lord's name in vain, there is another even more common way. Fr. Jerome Young once said that when people say the creed in Mass they often drone on as though they were reading the telephone book, the words are committed to memory but they don't connect the meaning with the words. The consequence is that our hearts are far from our lips. Jesus wishes that when we speak, we speak from the fullness of our hearts in peace. This is the challenge for us as we live out the second commandment. You could also think about how you make the sign of the cross. Is it done sloppily or hurriedly, or without the accompanying words, "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Ultimately the Lord's name is beautiful, good, and it saves. Consider psalm 8, "O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth". Our names are sacred as well, because God calls us by name. The devil accuses us by our sins or by the illusion of sins, but God calls us by name. In following the second commandment we can strive to remind ourselves and others how holy God is to us.
