All of the younger classes continue to learn a new musical "word of the week," as they build their music fundamentals through both intellect and play. As the classes work hard on the musical, there is a lot going into this--including solos, small group singing, singing and acting in character, harmonies for the older classes, choreography, and knowing when to come in with their parts.
