From the desk of Father Baier...

I asked Ramon Camacho, our seminarian for the summer to write an introduction. Here it is below He will arrive on June 13 and will stay with us until the end of July.

Hello! My name is Ramon Camacho, and I just finished my 1st year of priestly formation at St. Patricks Seminary in Menlo Park, CA. I will be staying with Fr. Baier this summer and helping out around St. Paul's as much as I can. Before arriving, I would like to take this opportunity to share more about myself with you.

I was born in Salem and grew up in the Santiam Canyon in Stayton, attending Immaculate Conception Parish. My family has always been rooted in our rich Catholic faith, with a devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe; however, my conversion would not come until much later in life. In-



itially, I desired to become a journalist, working in media, but the Lord had other plans. I would best describe my life as a series of carefully-planned, beautiful interruptions. In the Lord's kindness, He interrupted what I had planned and was doing, rescued me from darkness and my own designs, and brought me into greater communion with Him. For that, I am so grateful.

Upon having a personal encounter with God, I became motivated to learn more about my faith, which awakened a strong love for catechesis and evangelization. Before eventually becoming a seminarian for the Archdiocese of Portland, I worked three years in my home parish in Stayton as Director of Communications, assistant youth minister, and briefly as Director of Religious Education. Most recently, I completed one year of serving the people of St. Paul Parish in Silverton as an Administrative Assistant. It is through serving God's people in these capacities that the calling to discern priesthood has become ever stronger.

I am very excited to be assigned to St. Paul's this summer, and I look forward to meeting all of you. You are all in my prayers, and I ask you all to please continue to pray for Fr. Baier as he shepherds this beautiful community of faith! Until we meet soon, see you in the Eucharist!

SCHOOL SPOTLIGHT—Language Arts

The 3rd-8th graders continue to work hard in Language Arts, and their hard work is paying off as the school year comes to a close!

Specifically, the 3rd and 5th graders have been working on their public speaking and presenting skills, among other skills, by creating book reports every 1-2 months. They are reading books that interest them in their own time, and presenting these books in a book report such as a setting map, a comic book about their book, and some other various formats. They then present their project to the class! They are then taking comprehension tests on their books called AR tests to earn points.
