Dear all,



Even though my baptismal saint is Peter, I always think of Saint Paul as one of my favorite saints besides Peter.

In the summer of 2019 I spent a couple of months in Rome as a member of the Rome Experience for seminarians studying in the US. During those two months I spent multiple visits to the Basilica of Saint Paul Outside the Walls. There was a different atmosphere to the Basilica of Saint Paul Outside the Walls compared to Saint Peter's Basilica. Perhaps it had to do with the lesser number of visitors coming to visit, but for me the relic that was on display above the tomb of Saint Paul was what attracted me and kept me coming back to visit. What was on display for the faithful to view is a chain that was used on Saint Paul on his way to Rome.

Who could ever think of a man, who persecuted the early Church, turned around and became a great instrument of God? Not only so, Saint Paul was named the Apostle to the Gentiles. He wrote a number of letters and spread Christianity throughout the Mediterranean region. The Church would not be who she is today without St. Paul. Because of Saint Paul, we too have become sons and daughters of God through our baptism in Christ.

In the Acts of The Apostles we read of the great work of Paul in Antioch, he and Barnabas went and taught the people of God and here at Antioch the disciples of our Lord, Jesus Christ, were first called Christians (Acts 11:26). Throughout his Apostleship, Paul went on several missionary journeys evidenced in the letters he wrote to the different Christian communities encouraging them to continue to practice their faith. What Paul was preaching to the Christian communities of his time were the encouragement to persevere in the faith and the continued conversion. "Conversion" is exactly what Saint Paul did, his personal experience of turning around: he redirected the energy he spent on persecuting the people of God to building up new Christians. For Christians, conversion is a life time process, it does not stop at baptism or when we enter the Church at Easter Vigil. When we experience conversion, we turn away from our old way of life to a new way of life in Christ. We are changed. Conversion is not something we do on our own but it is a response to God's love for us. The more we open up to this love of God, the more we experience in ourselves the energy to move forward in Christ.

As we anticipate the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul Wednesday, June 29th, we, a parish taken after Saint Paul, are called to constant conversion of heart in our daily lives, so that God can continue to be gloried in each one of us and that Saint Paul parish community is always united as one. Just as Christ was in Paul and Paul was in Christ, and so we are in Christ and Christ is in us.
