## From the desk of Fr. Baier...

Marriage in the Church is different from what we call civil marriage. It's the difference between a covenant and a contract. Today I celebrated a wedding Mass for Collin and Agnes at St. Mary's in Mt. Angel. The moment of sacramental marriage happens when the couple, the groom and the bride, make their vows. They can't simply make up their own vows in a Catholic wedding but they make the standard vows of the Church. "I, Collin, take you, Agnes, to be my wife. I promise to be faithful to you, in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health, to love you and to honor you all the days of my life." There actually is another option of vows that go like this: "I, Collin, take you Agnes, for my lawful wife, to have and to hold, from this day forward, for better or worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish until death do us part." In order for the marriage to be valid those words need to be spoken by the bride and the groom, but, not only spoken, but truly meant. A groom who says his vows but secretly is thinking, well if this doesn't work out for me, if she gets sick, I'll marry someone else, that groom isn't really entering into the marriage with his bride. It may look like marriage on the wedding day, but his heart is not giving itself totally to his bride. When we talk about marriages we say that they are free, total, faithful, and fruitful. A true marriage is entered into freely by the spouses. They are never forced or pressured to get married by circumstances or by others. Out of the billions of potential spouses on earth, Collin and Agnes freely chose each other. Marriage is total because it is the making of oneself to be a gift for the other totally. It is to share one's very life with each other, not holding back for one's self. Marriage is faithful because the couple is called to pray together and to encourage one another in prayer. Moreover they are called to honor the promises, the vows, they have made faithfully to each other. Marriage is fruitful because when things are done well in a marriage, freely, totally, and faithfully, the couple will bear fruit for the Church and the community.

Consider these words of St. John Chrysostom that Deacon James Thurman shared at the wedding homily today, that a husband should share with his wife, Show her that you value her company, and prefer being at home to being out. Esteem her in the presence of your friends and children. Praise and show admiration for her good acts; and if she ever does anything foolish, advise her patiently. Pray together at home and go to Church; when you come back home, let each ask the other the meaning of the readings and the prayers. If you are overtaken by poverty, remember Peter and Paul, who were more honored than kings or rich men, though they spent their lives in hunger and thirst. Remind one another that nothing in life is to be feared, except offending God. If your marriage is like this, your perfection will rival the holiest of monks.
