From the desk of Deacon Anthony...

This last Saturday we celebrated the Memorial of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Growing up I often saw my grandmother wearing the brown scapular, not knowing what it was for, but sensing that it was important to my grandmother and her devotion to our Blessed Mother as the first prayer my grandmother ever taught me was the Hail Mary. From first learning the Hail Mary prayer from my grandmother, my devotion to our Blessed Mother has now been a daily Rosary meditating on the mysteries of the day.

So why should we have a devotion to Mary? Devotion to Mary is an easy, short, perfect, and secure way of attaining union with Our Lord, Jesus Christ. Having a devotion to the Blessed Virgin helps us to be ready, steadily commit ourselves to God's and the Church's teachings, and to live by the Blessed Virgin's virtues of faith, hope, and love. A true devotion to Mary is one that is interior, tender, holy, constant, and disinterested which should come from the mind, the heart, and the love we have for our Blessed Virgin. According to Saint Louis de Monfort, it is the kind of tender love which is full of confidence. It leads us to avoid sin and to imitate the virtues of the Blessed Virgin: humility, obedience, lively faith, continual prayer, universal mortification, divine purity, ardent charity, heroic patience, angelic sweetness, and her divine wisdom (De Montfort 55). To have a perfect devotion is to continue to ask for the intercession from Mary because she is our Mother. As our Mother, she gives us everything she has, therefore we should give her everything we have. We can present to her our body with all its senses and members; our soul and all its power; our exterior good fortune; our interior and spiritual good: merits, virtues, good works of past, present, and future. All of this leads us to uniting with Jesus Christ, to whom, as our Redeemer and our God, we owe all we are (De Montfort 67).

Devotion to the Blessed Virgin means devoting ourselves entirely to the service of God, it is the most powerful employment that one can have. It motivates us to imitate the example of Jesus Christ and of the Holy Trinity and practice humility. It obtains for us the good offices with Mary, because Mary, who is Mother of Mercy and sweetness, never lets herself to be outdone in giving her love to her children who give themselves entirely to her, to honor and serve her (De Montfort 77). All our work that we offer to Mary, she purifies and embellishes them, makes them acceptable to her Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. She never keeps anything for herself. If we praise and glorify her, she, in turn, praises and glorifies her Son for us. The Blessed Virgin loves her children, "I love those who love me" (Prov. 8:17) because she is our true Mother and a mother always loves her children. She fosters and nurtures us, she conducts and directs us, she defends and protects us, and most importantly she intercedes for us.

Through this devotion, the Holy Spirit will guide us through his dear spouse, Mary, to help us understand our inner being, our own evil, our corruption and incapacity for anything good, we will have knowledge and contempt of self (De Montfort 115). We will be able to participate in Mary's faith, the Blessed Mother will share with us a portion of her faith which is the greatest faith on earth, because she sees all things clearly in God by the light of Glory. She helps us have a great confidence in God and in her. Her soul will communicate itself to us to glorify the Lord. Her spirit will enter ours to rejoice in God (De Montfort 118). The devotion helps transform the faithful souls by Mary into the likeness of Jesus Christ.

"Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thine intercession was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my mother; to thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen." - The Memorare
